JOB TITLE: Civil Design Technician II

REPORTS TO: Civil Design Manager

SUMMARY:

Assists higher-level Engineering Technicians and Project Engineers in the application of principles, methods, and techniques of civil engineering technology by performing the following duties.

PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

- Assists in client contact and communication pertaining to specific projects.
- Assists in the development of probable construction cost estimates for projects within the department.
- Assists in the analysis of reports, maps, drawings, tests, and aerial photographs to plan and design projects.
- Prepares design computations and quantity estimates.
- Assists in the preparation of reports, specifications, plans, construction schedules, and permits for projects.
- Instructs technicians to reduce design to final drawings.
- Possesses and maintains above-average skills in the use of AutoCAD and Civil 3D in the following areas:
 - 1. Three-dimensional surface modeling
 - 2. Processing and managing survey point data.
 - 3. Creating and manipulating alignments, profiles, and cross-sections for linear projects
- Provides technical support to other staff in expertise and is cross-trained to have the ability to perform multiple duties.
- Ability to draft parcels and subdivision boundaries from legal descriptions using manual or CAD techniques.
- Assists higher-level Engineering Technicians and Project Engineers by drafting detailed drawings of structures and installations including plan & profile drawings for roads, bridges, pipelines, rail spurs, site plans, grading plans, drainage plans, and utility plans.

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• Assists civil engineers in drafting site grading plans, site drainage/erosion control plans, site utility plans, civil details, and civil schedules.

SECONDARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

- Understands surveying terminology and other concepts related to civil engineering and construction practices.
- Accompanies survey crew in the field to locate construction markers or to collect data required for the preparation of construction drawings.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE:

Associate's degree or equivalent from a two-year college or technical school with 3 years of experience or no Associate's degree with 5 years of verifiable experience. Preferably college curricula would emphasize pre-engineering, engineering technology, construction technology, or civil engineering technology courses.

LANGUAGE SKILLS:

Ability to read and comprehend simple instructions, short correspondence, and memos. Ability to write simple correspondence. Ability to effectively present information in oneon-one and small group situations to customers, clients, and employees of the organization.

MATHEMATICAL SKILLS:

Ability to calculate figures and amounts such as percentages, area, circumference, and volume. Ability to apply concepts of basic algebra and geometry.

REASONING ABILITY:

Ability to apply commonsense understanding to carry out instructions furnished in written, oral, or diagram form. Ability to deal with problems involving several concrete variables in standardized situations.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable

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accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to sit and talk or listen. The employee is occasionally required to stand; walk; use hands to finger, handle, or feel objects, tools, or controls; reach with hands and arms; and stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl.
